**Course Description:** Exploration of ideas using painting media and techniques.

**Semester Hours Credit:** 3

**Lecture/Lab Hours:** 2-4

**Prerequisite:** ARTS 2316, or instructor approval

**Textbook(s):** *As announced by instructor*

**Course Learning Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will:

1. Prepare and maintain tools and equipment.
  2. Develop skills and craft in painting techniques.
  3. Study composition and color as related.
  4. Experience individual growth in the fundamental direction of five (5) selected known artists for study as follows:
    - a. Research, read, visit museums, sketch and anything else done to expand student knowledge on a particular artist's life and art style.
    - b. With all the gathered research from above, sketch, organize and prepare a painting which reflects student's studies and/or similar subject matter of chosen artist.
    - c. Learn preparation of ground support – stretch and prime canvas. Paint, paint, paint.
    - d. Complete painting and prepare for oral report of student's study. Critique of final project.
- \*Note: Each artist chosen for study will take a frame period of approximately three (3) weeks each.*
5. Experience use of varied ground supports – stretched and prime canvas. Student preparation of supports.
  6. Experience varied painting techniques of realism and expressionism.
  7. Experience use of controlled palette (color scheme) from monochromatic, primary colors plus neutrals and full-color palette with varied tools for paint application of brushes and palette knife.
  8. Acquire a working knowledge of nomenclature and terms related to painting as evidenced by a short final quiz.
  9. Experience use of view finders for designing composition and use of red cellophane window for determining value patterns.
  10. Acquire first-hand knowledge of natural and man-made environment through use.

**Evaluation Methods:**

1. Research on art and artists with beginning development into self-style. Written and oral reports/critiques.
2. Attendance – a total of no more than two (2) absences, excused or unexcused, unless granted by special permission from the instructor or Dean. Without granted special permission, more than three (3) absences reduces the final grade for the semester and more than five (5) absences results in a drop from the course.
3. Completion of problems with adherence to empirical and quantitative skills.
4. Participation in student exhibit at end of the semester.

***\*Student plagiarism on assignments will result in an automatic F on that particular assignment. A second offense will automatically cause the student to be dropped from the class with an F.***
