

A native South Texan, Sharon G. received her Bachelor of Arts in History with a minor in Political Science from Texas A&I University in 1976. She then completed a Master of Science in Secondary Education with teaching fields in History, Political Science and Speech in 1981. In 2014, Mrs. Wilson added a Master of History and Political Science degree from Texas A&M University Kingsville.

While working on her first master's degree, Mrs. Wilson held a graduate teaching assistantship in the Speech Department for three years where she coached numerous Lone Star Conference and Pi Kappa Delta champions. In 1979, Mrs. Wilson accepted a job at Falfurrias High School. Over a thirty-three year period, courses she taught a wide variety of Speech and Social Studies classes. A forensic coach for fourteen years, Mrs. Wilson trained many regional and state qualifiers in extemporaneous speaking, prose and poetry interpretation, Lincoln Douglas debate and cross examination debate.

Mrs. Wilson was responsible for creating and directing Falfurrias High School's National History Day program for eighteen years. During that time Falfurrias High School history students advanced to state competition for eighteen consecutive years and to national competition ten times. Her students displayed their work in a variety of locations including the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum, the Smithsonian Museum of American History and the White House Visitor's Center in Washington, D.C., the Institute of Texan Cultures, Goliad State Park, the National Museum of the Pacific War in Fredericksburg, Texas, and at a meeting of the Comanche Nation. One group was filmed for inclusion in a PBS special. In 2008, Mrs. Wilson received the Texas Historical Association's State History Day Teacher-of-the Year award, the PBS/National History Day National Teacher of Merit Award at National History Day and was honored by the State Board of Education for her accomplishments.

In 2010, Mrs. Wilson began teaching as an adjunct for Coastal Bend College. For CBC she currently teaches Business and Professional Speaking, Mexican American History and U.S. History at Ben Bolt Palito Blanco High School along with Internet courses. She also teaches Government, Economics and U.S. History at Ben Bolt.

In 2011, Mrs. Wilson was named a James Madison Memorial Foundation Senior Fellow from Texas. As a Madison Fellow she completed a Master of Arts in History and Political Science at Texas A&M University Kingsville. including coursework at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C. As the result of her work, Mrs. Wilson has been named a James Madison Memorial Fellowship Teacher Scholar of the Constitution.

In 2013, Humanities Texas recognized Mrs. Wilson with an Outstanding Teaching of the Humanities Award for exemplary contributions in teaching, curriculum development and extracurricular programs at Brooks County ISD and at Ben Bolt Palito Blanco ISD.

In her spare time, Mrs. Wilson enjoys spending time with her husband, Don, their three sons and their grandson. She enjoys photography, watching high school baseball, hunting, fishing, traveling, quilting and reading.
